Proverbs 19:11 = Patient - Overlooks offenses

Proverbs 20:3 = Peaceful - Avoids strife

Proverbs 22:11 = Pure heart, gracious speech

Proverbs 27:9 = Earnest counsel - Sincerely wants to help

Proverbs 27:10 = Helpful during times of trouble
